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Faculty Safety Procedures at the University of Missouri-St Louis

- If you are concerned for your safety or the safety of students, please contact Campus Police **immediately** at 314-516-5155. They will respond right away and, if necessary, involve the Office of Student Affairs.
- All Campus Police officers are trained to respond to crisis situations; most have additional Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) training to deal with behavioral problems. Faculty who have worked with the CIT officers have been very satisfied with their response.
- Our Police Department is part of a network of police and fire departments that are available at a moment's notice in case of an incident. UMSL officers are willing to provide training at faculty or staff meetings.
- Should you hear a fire alarm, siren, or other warning, please act immediately to ensure students' and your safety. Alarm maintenance is announced in advance, so please heed warnings to avoid real danger.
- When a student's behavior is troublesome, please report it to Student Affairs (314-516-5211) as soon as possible, even if you handle it. They'll determine the next steps and also keep a record in case others report the student's misbehavior. A single incident may not seem important, but a series of problems can raise flags. If you are dissatisfied with the response of Student Affairs, please contact the Vice Provost for Student Affairs, Curt Coonrod, directly.
- University Health, Wellness, & Counseling Services has compiled and posted [resources for coping with trauma](#). Counselors are available for those who wish to talk about the tragedy one-on-one or in a group setting. Psychologists at Health, Wellness and Counseling are also available in a preventative capacity to consult with faculty and staff about students who are troubled or troubling and assist them in making a referral to counseling or psychiatric treatment.
